Where Are You Storing Your Treasure? Matthew 6:19-21

Inspiration strikes in the most interesting moments of one's day. I have been trying to figure out what to write for this month's newsletter article for the last couple of weeks. I have prayed about it, sought Scripture about it, and even considered many topics from various resources I have been reading from.

However, to my chagrin I was not been able to nail down a topic, that is till today, and it wasn't even the most meaningful moment of my day. All I was doing was plugging in my external hard drive and then whammy it hit me.

Here's a question, do you know what an external hard drive is? It's a device that I discovered some twenty years ago that is an absolute lifesaver to anyone who wishes to write and keep their electronic records safe. It is a handy little gadget that plugs into one of the ports of your computer and which enables you to save beaucoup data [a little French lingo --Ed.] and information safely tucked away from your computer, a computer that may one day crash and cause you to lose *all* your information.

thinking led me to consider what Jesus says in Matthew 6:19-21.

Leading up to this portion of the Sermon on the Mount Jesus instructed his listeners not to be religious for religious sake, but to work the work of righteousness. Then he said, "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in or steal; for where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (NASB)

What treasure are we storing up and where are we keeping it? What do we treasure that reflects our hearts? I like my external hard drive, but I know that it

is still a mechanical device that may one day stop working and then my attempts to save important information will be lost forever.

I could have digital moths creep in and ruin it, or it could fall out of my computer bag and be run over, crushed, and destroyed, or it may be splashed by some wayward coffee at Dunkin Donuts and short circuited. The point is my treasure, which isn't much but means a lot to me, can easily be lost.

However, what is stored up in heaven is something that can never be taken from you. When you feed the poor with the love of Christ, you are storing up treasure in heaven. When you share the Gospel of Jesus, whether the person accepts or rejects, you are storing up treasure in heaven. When you help the needy, you are storing up treasure in heaven. When you are persecuted for your faith, you are storing up treasure in God's glorious heaven.

And the wonderful thing about such treasure is that it is automatically deposited into the vault of God's love and can never be taken away. When we serve Christ because we love him, the treasure builds and accumulates with folding interest for eternity.

No one, no thing, no incident, no accident, and no enemy can ever take it away from you. In heaven that treasure is in your name and in your name only.

What are you doing to build the treasure in heaven? Here's a little secret. You can't build it if you are intentionally trying to build it. In other words, if you are doing earthly righteous acts, good social deeds, and checklist meritorious works hoping to get heavenly treasure then you will not have it when you get there, for Christ tells us in the Sermon on the Mount do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing (Matt. 6:3).

But if you serve Christ with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your might, and with all your mind, then it will result in works of righteousness that glorify our Savior. The more you focus on Him and the more you help others in His name for His glory and for His kingdom, then your eternal treasure will be sound and secure waiting for the day you enter into His glory.

Let me encourage you today to consider that which you are storing up for eternity: is it for your glory or for His?

May you invest wisely in God's Savings and Holdings.

On Sept. 4th at 6:30 p.m., Pastor Al Page will begin a Fall Bible Series. The entire Book of Isaiah will be covered in this 12 week series.

Isaiah is the first book of the prophets in the Hebrew Bible and the first of the major prophets in the Christian Old Testament. Isaiah wrote his prophesies from around 739 B.C. to about 681 B.C.

In 66 chapters, he wrote to the people of Judah who, as a nation, had turned from the Lord toward other gods. His major theme was about salvation if only the people would heed the warnings of judgment and repent of their sins.

This book also provides the most comprehensive prophecy in the Old Testament of the life of Jesus Christ, even though it was written some 700 years before the birth of the Savior.

9/11, Seventeen Years Later

On Sept. 11, 2001 almost 3,000 Americans and other nationalities were killed in the worst pre-meditated attack since Pearl Harbor. The anniversary of 9/11 in New York City will be marked at Ground Zero with four moments of silence – to observe the times when, under a clear blue sky, each plane hit and each tower fell:

8:46 a.m. – American Airlines Flight 11 out of Boston crashes into the north World Trade Center Tower; 9:03 a.m. – United Airlines Flight 175 from Boston hits the south Trade Center Tower:

10:05 a.m. – The south tower collapses.

10:28 a.m. – The north tower collapses.

Also that morning, two other airliners crashed: 9:43 a.m.: American Airlines Flight 77 crashes into the
