Preparing for Worship

Pastor Jim is on vacation as this issue of Hillside's newsletter goes to press. So he asked the "B" team to write the Pastor's column for October.

I'm back in full time ministry once again. I had forgotten how much time it takes to prepare to lead Sunday School, prepare a sermon, write a newsletter articles once a month, and the many other duties a pastor performs.

The trash gets taken out, the coffee pots are ready to go, restrooms are cleaned, floors are vacuumed, bulletins are prepared, The Lord's Supper preparation is done, and so on. Yes, our pastor does what needs to be done in preparation for worship services.

This brings me to the subject of "Preparation for Worship."

The need for preparation.

Jesus gave specific instructions. His disciples did not know where to go to prepare for the Passover. The Passover had requirements that had to be followed in order for the Jews to participate.

Starting at Luke 22:8 Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, "Go and prepare the Passover for us, so that we may eat it." They said, "Where do you want us to prepare it?"

Jesus gave them specific instructions.

He said to them, "When you have entered the city, a man will meet you carrying a pitcher of water; follow him into the house that he enters."

The disciples followed Jesus directions without question. His instructions would seem unreasonable to most people. Many commentators say that Jesus had made previous arrangements with the man. They overlooked that Immanuel (God with us) is all knowing and that He caused the virgin to conceive and resurrected the dead.

He knew that the man with the pitcher would be there and that he would respond without question. Finding an empty upper room this close to Passover time would have been impossible. Also, finding a man bringing water was unusual. That was a woman's task.

Jesus has given us directions that are the best. They may seem unreasonable, "Love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 20:19) It may be difficult to swallow our pride

"And you shall say to the owner of the house. 'The teacher says to you, "Where is the guest room in which I may eat the Passover with My disciples?" '

"And He will show you a large furnished upper room, prepare it there." They left and found everything just as He had told them and they prepared the Passover.

As we prepare for worship, we will find everything just as Jesus said. The room is ready. Are we prepared to worship? Church is not just something to do, but it is an encounter with Jesus. A place and time to worship Him and thank Him for the undeserved love and grace that He continues to give. Are you prepared for worship?
