Our world is faced with many immediate trials, from the virus pandemic, to a rise in bigotry, to hostility in politics, and hostility between nations, even a moderate drought. Thus a right perspective is called for when dealing with issues in life. What we really need is wisdom in how to take care of these various trials we experience.

Though I enjoy reading the entire Bible, one of my favorite books is the Book of James. It is full of just so much practicality and insight that one cannot walk away from it and not be motivated to enact all the precepts and truths found in it.

In James 1:5 is a great verse that speaks to those of us who at times of stress need practical insight into how to handle the problems we face. James wrote, "But if any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all generously and without reproach, and it will be given to him." Take that in for just a moment, reread it and pause to contemplate what it declares.

God in heaven is waiting for you and I to come to Him in faith asking for wisdom and, because He is such a gracious God, He will give it to us generously, not shunning us for asking for such a thing from Him. What James is telling us is that God will grant to us heavenly wisdom and perspective in our earthly problems. Let me tell you, it doesn't get any better than that.

What does this heavenly wisdom from above do for us? Well first it reveals to our hearts the true reality of our problems, in other words, some issues in life are really not that big of a deal. It's human nature to make mountains out of molehills when we are faced with some level of adversity. Receiving wisdom from on high provides a heavenly perspective that enables us to rightly and proportionately respond to those things that we face day-in and day-out.

Secondly, the wisdom God provides from on high enables us to distinguish between what is of earthly importance and what is of heavenly importance. Some trials brought into our lives are completely earthly in that we deal with issues because we are in a fallen world in need of grace.

However, some other issues we face may be of heavenly importance. It could be that the person we are fighting with needs to see the love of Christ in us instead, or our loss in life is to test us in our faith, or the difficulty with our kids might actually be a test to stand for God's word in their lives as they are listening to the world instead. Having heavenly wisdom enables us to have discernment in knowing how to approach the problems with a keener insight.

Thirdly, when we gain heavenly wisdom from God we can glorify Him for giving us the victories we experience. It's human desire to allow pride to take the lead in boasting how we figured something out, or overcome difficulties with sheer will, or cunningly out-maneuvered our problem and found a way out or around it.

High Court Affirms Religious Access to State Programs

June 30, 2020

WASHINGTON (BP) -- The U.S. Supreme Court narrowly upheld Tuesday (June 30) a state tax credit scholarship program that includes religious schools, thereby maintaining its recent support of the right of faith groups to participate in government programs.

The high court voted 5-4 to overturn a Montana Supreme Court decision. The Montana high court invalidated the entire program in a 2018 opinion because the law includes religious schools. In overturning a lower court decision, the Montana justices said the plan violates the state constitution's "no-aid provision" regarding religious schools.

Writing for the majority, Chief Justice John Roberts said the Montana high court's decision violated the First Amendment clause that guarantees the free exercise of religion.

Religious freedom advocates widely applauded the court's ruling. [The four dissenting justices need to go. --Editor]
