Thankful Hearts

Psalm 86:11-13

offered up many prayers and psalms of thanksgiving to the Lord. While focusing on God's safe deliverance from others he wrote in Psalm 86:11-13:

"Teach me Your way, O LORD;

I will walk in Your truth;

Unite my heart to fear Your name

I will give thanks to You, O Lord my God, with all my heart, And will glorify Your name forever.

For Your lovingkindness toward me is great,

And You have delivered my soul from the depths of Sheol."

We can see that David knew what it was to have a thankful heart. Notice a couple of things really quickly in this passage. First, even though David had a solid relationship with God he asked God to teach him His ways so that he would walk in God's truth. What a wonderful request that any individual can ask, for the one who knows the will of God and obeys it knows peace with God and a thankful heart. Second, he asked God to knit his heart to Him so that he would know to fear the name of the Lord. David knew that this would produce within him a thankful heart based upon a heart that was full of the grace and love of God which would produce within him a desire to praise God all his life. Last, David declared a truth about God that many in our world today do not know or have not experienced and that is the lovingkindness of God.

Such a blessed reception of the outpouring of God's affection is something that all of us should desire to sing praises unto Him for His great love, forgiveness, and compassion upon each one of us. David knew the blessed protection of God in a way that many did not know in his time. For us this declares an eternal reality that our very souls are delivered from the depths of Sheol and we will enjoy our God forever because of His lovingkindness towards us in Christ.

We as Christians know more than most what the lovingkindness of God means in our salvation. Does this not invoke in you a thankful heart? Does this not produce in your very soul a desire to sing, write, and proclaim God's praises? Oh, give thanks unto the Lord for He is good and His lovingkindness last for generations upon generations.

Let us celebrate this more than anything else this upcoming Thanksgiving Day. Let us choose to focus on that which God has accomplished in our lives in spite of what has happened this past year. Let us focus not just on what He has already done for us in His glory, but what He will do even more through us to glorify His name and bestow His blessings.

Praise God and give thanks unto His name for He is good and His lovingkindness is everlasting.

The Older Brother



The following story comes from Our Daily Bread and was written by Mart DeHaan.

Author Henri Nouwen recalls his visit to a museum in St. Petersburg, Russia, where he spent hours reflecting on Rembrandt's portrayal of the prodigal son. As the day wore on, changes in the natural lighting from a nearby window left Nouwen with the impression that he was seeing as many different paintings as there were changes of light. Each seemed to reveal something else about a father's love for his broken son.

Nouwen describes how, at about four o'clock, three figures in the painting appeared to "step forward." One was the older son who resented his father's willingness to roll out the red carpet for the homecoming of his younger brother, the prodigal. After all, hadn't he squandered so much of the family fortune, causing them pain and embarrassment in the process? (Luke 15:28–30).

The other two figures reminded Nouwen of the religious leaders who were present as Jesus told His parable. They were the ones who muttered in the background about the sinners Jesus was attracting (vv. 1–2).

Nouwen saw himself in all of them – in the wasted life of his youngest son, in the condemning older brother and religious leaders, and in a Father's heart that's big enough for anyone and everyone.

What about us? Can we see ourselves anywhere in Rembrandt's painting? In some way, every story Jesus told is about us.

Election Day, Nov. 3, 2020

As this newsletter goes to press, The Baptist Press published an interesting story called, "Unity encouraged as election day nears." Part of the story reported on an increase in political support by pastors since 2016.

"The proportion of pastors who have endorsed a candidate for president or another office has increased in 2020, LifeWay Research reported Oct. 27. The study showed 32 percent of American Protestant pastors have personally endorsed candidates this year outside of their church role, compared to 22 percent in 2016.

"At least one Southern Baptist entity head has endorsed Trump this year. R. Albert Mohler Jr., president of Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, announced his support for the president after refusing to vote for either Trump or Clinton in 2016."
