New Tuesday Night Bible Study

Starting on May 10, Pastor Al Page is to begin a new study series. This series is to cover the twelve Old Testament (OT) Minor Prophets from Hosea to Malachi.

That term originated in the late 4th century and simply referred to the fact that their writings were much shorter than the Major Prophets like Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Daniel.

Perhaps they should have called them the "Longer Prophets" and the "Shorter Prophets," Or maybe the "Verbose Prophets" and the "Terse Prophets."

A timeline of Biblical history shows that Jonah was the earliest around 780-850 B.C. and Malachi was the last one around 430 B.C. The ordering of the books in the Old Testament is not chronological, perhaps because of a lack of accurate dating when these books were organized into the Old Testament. That would be an interesting first question to ask Pastor Al.

Lorenzo's Story

The following story appeared in a recent issue of the Our Daily Bread newsletter.

Lorenzo Miguel grew up in Muquiyauyo, Peru and was influenced as a high school student by radical views. One week in March 1970, he was invited to an evangelistic rally where he heard the gospel message.

For the whole week, he raged against the message, but by Thursday when the preacher gave an

invitation to accept Jesus as Savior, Lorenzo found himself moved by the Holy Spirit. And he has never regretted it.

In 1990, Lorenzo was sponsored by Calvary Church in Grand Rapids, Michigan to become a church planter in a Spanish-speaking community. He realized he needed to become fluent in English since he was living in the United States.

Wanting to improve his English, he tried a number of different methods but found that by copying the words of the Our Daily Bread devotional, he learned to write English and by listening to the Our Daily Bread devotional on the radio every day, he became fluent in spoken English and grew closer in relationship to God.

"By the grace of God," Lorenzo said, "in 2019 I finished my Master's Degree in Ministry Leadership with an emphasis on pastoral care at Calvary Seminary. I can say 95 percent of my English I learned from Our Daily Bread."

"I don't know another program better than Our Daily Bread to learn English as a second language," Lorenzo said. "To me, this is the only one for my soul, for my spirit, and my English."

From Peru to Michigan to all across the globe, one small act of giving, praying, and sharing can result in eternal impact for many.

A Plague of Locusts

Beginning in 1873, the state of Minnesota fell victim to vast swarms of grasshoppers (AKA Rocky Mountain Locusts), moving east after devastating the Dakotas. Some called them locusts; they devoured crops. As in the Biblical accounts, the skies were darkened by the clouds of insects and the people knew great fear.

They beseeched the young state's government to save them. Two governors, Horace Austin and Cushman K. Davis tried, directing their efforts to providing some economic relief but encourage charitable giving to the victims of the infestation.

The plague continued and both governors were replaced.

The next governor, elected in 1876 was John S. Pillsbury, a New Hampshire native who had migrated to Minnesota and helped found the eponymous milling giant. His philosophy focused on fighting the grasshoppers rather than giving aid to their victims. In this, he differed from his predecessors.

There was a case to be made for each approach; their merits were hotly debated. In the meantime, many were mobilized to destroy the eggs of the scourge. But still the menace raged. Five hundred thousand acres of rich cropland had been destroyed.

The desperate citizens asked for a day of prayer. Gov. Pillsbury obliged. He proclaimed that April 26, 1877, would be the day of fasting, humiliation, and prayer set aside for Minnesotans to beseech the Lord to end the plague. He even donated \$10,000 out of his own pocket to build a chapel.

And as that day of prayer drew near, the heavens opened and Minnesota was gifted with harsh weather, rain, freezing rain, then snow and sleet that killed many of the ominous eggs. The storm lasted for two days. Farmers redoubled their efforts to destroy the grasshoppers. They soon left the state to the rejoicing and gratitude, by many, for Divine deliverance!

Gov. Pillsbury was given great credit for calling forth this apparent miracle. He was rewarded with re-election to two further terms. His name is still honored.

This true story comes to mind at our own time of plague. It is relevant to the speculation over what impact our pandemic will have on future national elections. That could depend on how, whether and when deliverance comes.

But the folks of Minnesota will long remember that glorious day in April 1877 when NH native, Gov. John Pillsbury -- despite skeptics -- called for a state-wide Day of Prayer. And those savage swarms of grasshoppers disappeared!
