Proverbs 14:12

What does that mean? It means that humanity plans and plots throughout life thinking that the decisions being made apart from God seems right in all that they are doing, but ultimately because God has no part in those decisions, it leads to their ruin and even death.

There are many things in life that individuals think are right, humanly speaking, I mean after all if they didn't perceive the rightness of their thinking they would change it, right? However, left to themselves they will continue to move forward and never consider the ways or will of God in their plans.

There are many people out there who will never consider the long-term eternal effects of their life decisions because they either live in the moment or they don't believe God, if there is one, cares what they do. Thus they go about their daily lives with no concern of the divine rightness or wrongness of their decisions unless it may affect someone else in their lives.

This is never more dangerous than when it comes to the eternal state of a living soul. The world says there are many ways to heaven, and a resounding

chorus throughout all religions cries "amen" to such a statement. To the human mind it makes sense that all roads lead to God, but it is surface level understanding at best and it seems right to such people; in the end their perceived understanding of God is wrong, thus it leads to death.

How terrible it is for individuals to go their whole life thinking they are right with God and that they have figured another way to heaven apart from the eternal cleansing work of the blood of Christ Jesus, but in the end only to find when they stand before Him in heaven He will not acknowledge them for their sinful pride of going it their own way. Such belief leads to death.

Oh they who proclaim many ways to heaven think they are right, they believe their reasoning is sound, they even assert the wisdom of their ways in contrast to the narrowness of Bible thumping Christians, but what they perceive as true is not and ultimately has dire and deadly consequences when it is all said and done.

When I think about that vicious arachnid and her belief that her way was the right way to survive and thrive in this life I am reminded that in the end her approach led to her death and she is no more. A day of ruin and destruction by way of a righteous right foot came upon her with much pain and turmoil in her short lived existence here on earth and that death is final. So too many people will hope in the day to come that they were good enough, or they did enough good things to outweigh the bad, or that God is a loving God who will not cast them away from Himself, or that as long as they had faith in faith itself that everything will work out then they will be fine.

Such thinking will in the end lead to eternal death. Not the death of dying in the flesh, for everyone will be raised to life again on the Day of Judgment, but the second death that Revelation tells us falls upon those who do not know Christ and then are sent to eternal punishment for their sin, for they did not trust in the Lord Jesus as their Savior to atone for their very souls. I'm sure such people are living their lives now in way that seems right to them, but the warning is given, in the end it leads to death.

However, it doesn't have to be so for the warning is given in Scripture to repent of your sin, turn to Christ for salvation, and be born again into new life eternal with Him, and you will be saved from that eternal death.

Will you accept Christ today as your Savior? I pray you will for you will no longer be on a path that leads to death, but on the right path God has placed before you leading to life eternal with Him.

tough life in the wilderness (Deuteronomy 2:7)—life can be hard. But do we see the other parallels? We create our own itinerary, turning from God's way (1:42–43). Like the Israelites, we often grumble about getting our needs met (Numbers 14:2). In our daily fretting, we likewise doubt God's purposes (v. 11). The story of the Israelites is repeated over and over in our own.

God assures us that if we follow His path, He'll deliver us into a far better place than Dismal. He'll provide and we'll lack nothing we really need (Deuteronomy 2:7; Philippians 4:19). Yet as much as we already know this, we often fail to do it. We need to follow God's roadmap.

It's a bit more of a drive, but another six hours by car would take you from the town of Panic to the place known as Assurance, West Virginia. If we let God direct our paths (Psalm 119:35), we'll journey in joy with Him at the wheel – blessed assurance indeed!
