Making Every Moment Count

The following item comes from the *Our Daily Bread* devotional for April 11, 2022. It deals with Jesus' second coming, the unknown future, and our own mortality.

Read Matthew 24:36-44 and then read the insight by ODB writer James Banks.

The halted hands of a pocket watch in a library's archives at the University of North Carolina tell a harrowing tale. They mark the exact moment (8:19 and 56 seconds) that the watch's owner Elisha Mitchell slipped and fell to his death at a waterfall in the Appalachian Mountains on the morning of June 27, 1857.

Mitchell, a professor at the university, was gathering data to defend his (correct) claim that the peak he was on—which now bears his name, Mount Mitchell—was the highest one east of the Mississippi. His grave is located at the mountain's summit, not far from where he fell.

As I ascended that mountain peak recently, I reflected on Mitchell's story and my own mortality and how each of us has only so much time. And I pondered Jesus' words about His return as He spoke to His disciples on the Mount of Olives: "So you also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him" (Matthew 24:44).

Jesus clearly indicates that none of us knows either the moment He'll return and establish His kingdom forever or when He may summon us to leave this world and come to Him. But He tells us to be prepared and "keep watch" (v. 42).

Tick...tick...The "clockwork" of our lives is still in motion—but for how long? May we live our moments in love with our merciful Savior, waiting and working for Him.

Editor's Note: New Hampshire's Mount Washington, home of the world's worst weather, is 6,288 ft. high but Mt. Mitchell, also known in Cherokee as Attakulla, is the highest peak east of the Mississippi River. It stands at 6,684 feet above sea level.

Maui churches after Lahaina fire: 'We're not going back to normal.'

MAUI, Hawaii (BP) – As the Aug. 8 Maui fires raged out of control in Lahaina, local churches on the island that were outside the burn area immediately began grappling not with whether they would respond but how.

In the immediate aftermath, Pastor Jay Haynes of Kahului Baptist Church in Kahului, along with fellow pastor Rocky Komatsu of Waiehu Community Church in Wailuku, helped deliver supplies on trucks down into Lahaina to help meet the most pressing physical needs of those displaced by the wildfire that consumed nearly the entire town of Lahaina. Haynes' message Sunday underscored their resolve to continue helping survivors who lost everything.
