Book Review: Studies in the Sermon on the Mount

On the back cover, Bible School founder J.F. Knapp urged us to "Read these pages again and again until the truth soaks through to your innermost consciousness."

Author Oswald Chambers (1874-1917) is best known for the classic devotional "My Utmost for His Highest." This "Studies" book, 142-pages long, focuses on God's character and the believer's conduct as found in Matthew chapters 5-7. It is filled with gems of wisdom like the following:

Chapter 2: On integrity he wrote: "Jesus taught by example and by precept that no one should stand up for his or her own honor but for the honor of another."

"Leave scandal alone; never touch it."

"Suspicion is always of the Devil, and it is the cause of people saying more than they need to say."

Chapter 3: "Have no other motive in giving than to please God."

"Develop the habit of having such a relationship to God that you do good without knowing it."

"Refuse to be swamped by the cares of this world, cut out nonessentials and continually revise your relationship to God, and see that you are concentrated absolutely on Him."

Dozens more gems could be presented but these few give you a sense of the spiritual depth and breadth of Chambers' writing.


