A Process of Decay

From the Pastor's Desk

In Romans 8:20-22 Paul mentions that even Creation is imperfect and looking forward to the perfection God will establish when Jesus returns. Notice that Paul says the Creation is caught in a process of DECAF.

**20 For the creation was subjected to frustration, not by its own choice, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope
21 that the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to DECAF and brought into the freedom and glory of the children of God.**

22 We know that the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time.

Without being scientists we all understand quite well about Creation's DECAF. Heat decays into cold. All of life decays into death. Objects in motion slow down and stop. Gardens and lawns decay into weeds.

But DECAF is also a fact in human affairs. Empires rise, fall and die. Churches that start out spiritual and idealistic are prone to decay into superficiality and materialism. Individual Christians have a tendency to decay into shallowness and sin.

UNLESS !! new energy is applied or injected. New energy stops and reverses DECAF and brings new life. For instance, you can prevent your attractive lawn or productive vegetable garden from decaying into weeds by regularly adding new energy in the form of weeding, mowing, and fertilizing. A bouncing ball will slow down and

stop bouncing, UNLESS you grab it and bounce it hard again.

How do you suppose we can stop and reverse the natural DECAF in human lives and affairs? For a person, reversing the DECAF requires the injection of new energy in the form of the spiritual power that comes from God. And we unlock God's spiritual power through constant spiritual renewal of faith, repentance for sin, regular worship of God, and harvesting God's wisdom from the Bible.

After decaying spiritually and committing a couple of the worst sins possible, King David sought to recover from his decay and enter into

new life as described by him in Psalm 51. After confessing his sins, in verses 10-12 he asks God for the injection of new energy he desperately needs.

**10 Create in me a pure heart, O God,
and renew a steadfast spirit within me.**

**11 Do not cast me from your presence
or take your Holy Spirit from me.**

**12 Restore to me the joy of your salvation
and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me.**

The Christian life has a lot in common with riding a bicycle. If you quit pedaling your bike (on flat ground) you will slow down and stop. To keep moving you have to keep pedaling.

The same is true in the Christian life: you're either injecting new spiritual energy OR you're decaying into coldness, lack of fruit, emptiness, and coming to a complete stop. You're either growing in the Christian life or you're slowing down to a stop. Keep pedaling! Seek God every day!!

Presidential Birthdays



The Gift of Trials

This devotional is based on 1 Peter in which the apostle Peter encouraged believers to endure their suffering as followers of Christ. Even Jesus had warned, “If they persecuted Me, they will persecute you also.” John 15:20.

Read 1 Peter 4:12-19 and then see how Our Daily Bread writer Patricia Raybon applied this to the Wright Brothers.



The two men conquered human flight, but the Wright brothers’ journey to success was never easy. Despite countless failures, ridicule, money woes, and serious injury to one of them, the brothers weren’t stopped by the trials they faced. As Orville Wright observed, “No bird soars in a calm.” The idea, according to biographer David McCullough, means that adversity can “often be exactly what you need to give you a lift higher.” Said McCullough, “Their joy was not getting to the top of the mountain. Their joy was climbing the mountain.”

The apostle Peter taught a similar spiritual principle to the persecuted early church. He told them, “Do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal that has come on you to test you” (1 Peter 4:12). This wasn’t a denial of suffering’s pain. Peter knew that hope in Christ grows our trust in God.

This is especially true when we suffer for being a believer in Jesus, as those early Christians did. Peter wrote to them, “Rejoice inasmuch as you participate in the sufferings of Christ, so that you may be overjoyed when his glory is revealed” (v. 13). He went on, “If you are insulted because of the name of Christ, you are blessed, for the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you” (v. 14).

As the Wright brothers’ character was hailed by their biographer, may others see God’s loving character at work in us. He uses our adversity to raise us to new heights.

What Is the Bible All About?

Our Daily Bread University now offers an online course with the foregoing title. When we think about creation and its importance in the story of the Bible, it gives us this clear picture that God is sovereign and worthy of praise. It also reminds us and lets us know that God is a God who has acted to make Himself known. Creation itself occurs because of God’s desire to be known and worshipped. In five lessons, this course helps you discover the common themes that connect the many books of the Bible and the role you play.
