Pastor's Desk (from p. 1)

A recent statistical study of our Southern Baptist Convention revealed that 43% of all SBC churches have an average Sunday worship attendance of less than 50 people. We're in that group. Churches with an average attendance of 50-99 make up another 27% of our denomination. So 70% of our churches nationwide average less than 100 on Sunday mornings.

The surprising fact is that most new Christians are baptized in those churches that average less than 100 people. There are many reasons why that is true, but one of the most important is that, in a smaller church, it's easier to get to know people. It's easier for an unbelieving person to make friends with Christians and learn by listening and watching why and how to become a Christian.

We're only 15-20 people, but we're just the right size to reach new people and lead them to faith in Jesus Christ. When a person visits our church there's no way to be overlooked or neglected or forgotten, unlike in a church of 100-500.

Here's another interesting fact. Out of the various sections of the country where our SBC churches are working, only in New England did our churches report growth in membership in the last year. We grew by 10%. All the other regions of the country reported losses in church membership.

We're just the right size to accomplish God's will and we're located in New England where our sister churches are growing along with us.

Sounds like Good News to me!

Where Are the Babies?

The efforts are well know of organizations trying to save the unborn from the horror of abortion. These include local groups like the Care Women's Center right here in Concord, NH and national organizations like Focus on the Family (https://www.family.org), the American Center for Law & Justice (https://aclj.org/), and Preborn (https://preborn.com/).

In a March 28 interview with Bret Baier on Fox News, Elon Musk was asked what keeps him up at night. After a long pause he said, "Well, there's a lot of things that I suppose that I worry about. And some of these things will seem esoteric to people. The birth rate is very low in almost every country, and unless that changes, civilization will disappear,"

Musk pointed to declining birth rates in the U.S. and Korea, warning that "nothing seems to be turning that around. Humanity is dying."

The Macrotrends.net web site reported "The current U.S. birth rate in 2025 is 11.994 births per 1,000 people, a 0.12% decline from 2024.

"The current U.S. fertility rate in 2025 is 1.787 births per woman, a 0.06% increase from 2024."

The key number of 2.1 births per woman means the population is replacing itself. Anything less means fewer people in future generations.

In Genesis 1:28, God said, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth, and subdue it." This directive emphasizes the importance of procreation and stewardship of the earth.

In sum, encourage your children and grandchildren to not give in to the doomsayers but heed God's call to have families and bring more children into the world.

Legacy of Love in Jesus

A recent topic in the Our Daily Bread Devotionals made me stop and think about how we spend time accumulating stuff. It reminded of a lyric in that Randy Travis song, "Three Wooden Crosses," The key phrase was "It's not what you take / when you leave this world behind you. / It's what you leave behind you / when you go."

First read John 13:31-36 and then read this essay by ODB writer Kenneth Petersen.

In Sweden, there's a concept known as döstädning. It literally means "death cleaning." The idea is that as we grow older, we should stop accumulating "stuff" and begin to cut out the clutter we have amassed throughout our lives.

"Swedish death cleaning" is actually a gift of love to children and friends, for it simplifies for them the task of wading through what we leave behind.

As believers in Jesus, at a certain age we think about our legacy—what survives us. This is often framed in terms of money, inheritance, or charitable giving—and there's much to be said for that. But it might be helpful to look at Jesus in His final hours with His disciples: "Where I am going, you cannot follow now, but you will follow later" (John 13:36). In two verses (vv. 34-35), He uses the word love or loved four times—His legacy was love. He told them: "As I have loved you, so you must love one another" (v. 34).

It may be good to do some "Swedish death cleaning" in our lives, removing clutter to leave behind only the most important things. But it really isn't about things or money. The most important legacy you can leave behind is your love for Jesus.

When children and friends remember you as one who loved Jesus, that's the best gift of all. It gives new meaning to the phrase "left behind."

More Men Attending Than Women

BOULDER, Colo. (BP) — Men have outpaced women in church attendance the past three years, reversing a longstanding trend of more women in the pews that narrowed in 2016, Barna said in its 2025 State of the Church release, created in partnership with Gloo.

Women had outpaced men in attendance since 2000, then at 47 percent to 38 percent, before men began outpacing women in 2022, at 35 percent to 30 percent. In 2024, 30 percent of men were attending weekly, compared to 27 percent of women.


